16	Again, in anticipation of what's
17	coming, we're trying to look at all
18	our utilities to see where we stand
19	with them. Trustee Annarella, our
20	DPW guy, along with Hans Vohs and his
21	staff, has been instrumental in
22	looking at the drains on a street by
23	street basis.
24	Additionally, the County flush
25	trucks will be servicing sanitary

3	Bid requests are being prepared for
4	parking meters, and all that implies.
5	Two other things: Please,
6	don't do any concrete work yet. At

11	get a much lower price than if we
12	went to a concrete company on our
13	own.
14	And, last but not least, the
15	arborist. Under Trustee Annarella,
16	the arborist, our tree surgeon, is
17	going to be here within the next two
18	weeks, so we're going to begin to
19	take care of the trees.
