- 8 can place them. Sometimes they don't want to be
- 9 placed. Just roaming around is not against the
- 10 law unless there is an offense.
- MR. ASHER: Aren't these cans and
- 12 stuff village property? We collect them with
- our recycling, we make money as a village from
- 14 them. Could that be an angle to write these
- 15 people a summons, or start breaking their shoes
- 16 to stop doing what they are doing? Whatever we
- 17 put on the street or is in the yard is collected
- 18 by us and we send that away and we make income
- 19 off that that is stealing what from us as a
- 20 village.
- MR. CORNACHIO: If you are putting it
- 22 out to be picked up, you are abandoning it.
- 23 Maybe the village, because it's in a village
- 24 container, might have the right to press
- 25 charges. The whole problem with vagrancy and



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    loitering is you have court decisions that have
3
    greatly expanded constitutional rights under new
    interpretations that says they can do that.
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               Now, they can't obstruct pedestrian
6
    traffic on the sidewalks, they can't jaywalk,
7
    obstruct vehicular traffic. They can't trespass
8
    on private property. I don't know if many
9
    homeowners would want to file a complaint.
